California Food Policy Advocates (CFPA) is a statewide public policy and advocacy organization dedicated to improving the health and well-being of low-income Californians by increasing their access to nutritious, affordable food.

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Introduction

The federal Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP), known as CalFresh in California, is the largest federal nutrition assistance program and a pivotal safety net benefit for low-income families and individuals. SNAP provides households with nutrition benefits to supplement their food budgets, increasing household purchasing power and access to nutritious, affordable food. Nationally, SNAP provides nutrition assistance for more than 44 million people each month. In California, CalFresh benefits currently reach more than 3.6 million people each month. With a participation rate of 55 percent, just over half of all eligible Californians participate in CalFresh.

Understanding the changing characteristics of CalFresh-eligible households is necessary to ensure that these households can access the nutrition resources required to lead healthy, productive lives. Knowledge of household characteristics can inform policy changes and administrative improvements.

This report presents data on CalFresh household characteristics for fiscal year 2012. The data describe characteristics for both CalFresh-eligible households and eligible, participating households based on information gathered by Mathematica Policy Research, Inc. using the MATH SIPP+ simulation model. The report outlines selected characteristics from the simulation process.

Summary of Findings

Findings from these data include:

- Participating CalFresh households frequently include children and are less likely to include senior or disabled members. Nearly sixty two percent of participating CalFresh households include children, 4.8 percent include seniors, and 1.7 percent include adults with disabilities.
- Most CalFresh-eligible households and participating CalFresh households have gross incomes below 130 percent of the Federal Poverty Level (FPL). CalFresh eligibility rules set the maximum gross income at 130 percent of FPL, with some exceptions for households that are categorically eligible, households that include seniors, and households with allowable income deductions. Only six percent of CalFresh-eligible households (and one percent of participating CalFresh households) have gross incomes above 130 percent of FPL.
- Approximately 46 percent of CalFresh-eligible households (and 36 percent of participating CalFresh households) have income from earnings. The substantial portion of CalFresh-eligible households with income in the form of earnings suggests that outreach strategies and policy solutions targeting working families are particularly relevant.

 The dependent care and medical deductions are important yet widely underutilized components of the CalFresh benefit calculation. Households that claim deductions may be entitled to higher benefits. Unfortunately, only 1.8 percent of participating CalFresh households claimed the medical deduction and 2.1 percent claimed the dependent care deduction in FY 2012.



These tables and charts describe CalFresh-eligible households and participating CalFresh households according to gross income as a percentage of the federal poverty level (FPL). For example, 489,000 (16.6 percent) of all CalFresh-eligible households have no income (Table 1a, Chart 1). Just over twenty eight percent of all participating households have no income (Table 1b, Chart 2). Among all CalFresh-eligible households with no income, 427,000 (87.3 percent), participate in CalFresh (Table 1b).



These tables and charts describe CalFresh-eligible households and participating CalFresh households according to the source(s) of household income. For example, 1,371,000 (46.6 percent) of all CalFresh-eligible households have income from earnings (Table 2a, Chart 3). Thirty six percent of all CalFresh participating households have income from earnings (Table 2a). Among all CalFresh-eligible households with income from earnings, 546,000 (39.8 percent), participate in CalFresh (Table 2b).



These tables and charts describe CalFresh-eligible households and participating CalFresh households according to eligibility for maximum and minimum levels of benefits. For example, 332,000 (11.3 percent) of all CalFresh-eligible household are eligible for the minimum benefit level (Table 3a, Chart 5). One percent of all participating households receive the minimum benefit (Table 3a, Chart 6). Among all CalFresh-eligible households that are eligible for the minimum benefit, 15,000 (4.5 percent) participate in CalFresh (Table 3b).



These tables and charts describe CalFresh-eligible households and participating CalFresh households according to the utilization of household income deductions. For example, 1,716,000 (58.3 percent) of all CalFresh-eligible households would utilize the excess shelter deduction (Table 4a, Chart 7). The excess shelter deduction is utilized by68.5 percent of all participating households (Table 4a). Among all CalFresh-eligible households that would utilize the excess shelter deduction, 1,040,000 (60.6 percent), participate in CalFresh (Table 4b, Chart 8).



These tables and charts describe CalFresh-eligible households and participating CalFresh households according to household size. For example, 1,273,000 (43.3 percent) of all CalFresh-eligible households are one-person households (Table 5a, Chart 9). Thirty nine percent of all participating households are one-person households (Table 5a, Chart 10). Among all CalFresh-eligible households that are one-person households, 592,000 (46.5 percent), participate in CalFresh (Table 5b).



These tables and charts describe CalFresh-eligible households and participating CalFresh households according to household composition. For example, 541,000 (18.4 percent) of all CalFresh-eligible households include an elderly adult (Table 6a, Chart 11). Nearly five percent of all participating households include an elderly adult (Table 6a). Among all CalFresh-eligible households with an elderly adult, 73,000 (13.5 percent) participate in CalFresh (Table 6b).

This table describes the total monthly benefit amounts and average monthly benefit amounts of CalFresh-eligible households and participating Calfresh households according to household characteristic. For example, all participating CalFresh households with no income receive a total of \$143,412 in monthly benefits with an average monthly benefit of \$335 per household (Table 7).

This table describes the average monthly benefits, income and value of deductions for CalFresh-eligible households and participating CalFresh households by type of income and deduction. For example, the average monthly benefit for all participating households is \$340 (Table 8). For all participating households with income, the average monthly gross income is \$736 and the average monthly new income is \$481 (Table 8).

Methodology

The report uses the MATH SIPP+ computer model developed by Mathematica Policy Research, Inc. in order to simulate CalFresh eligibility and participation. This model involves two components: a database and a computer program. The database tracks records of individual households and contains information about income, assets, and household demographic characteristics used to determine CalFresh eligibility. The computer program applies eligibility rules to each household in the database to determine whether a household would be eligible. If determined to be eligible, the program then determines the benefit a household would likely receive. The simulation model also predicts eligible household's participation in CalFresh. Using this prediction, the model shows eligible household's characteristics and potential benefit level.

Data

The MATH SIPP+ model uses data from the Survey of Income and Program Participation (SIPP) and incorporates state controls extracted from the Current Population Survey (CPS), both surveys are conducted by the US Census Bureau. CalFresh quality control data are uses to calibrate the MATH SIPP+ model so that estimates of the number and characteristics of participating CalFresh households are similar to administrative data. Detailed data on state asset and categorical eligibility rules were also used to update the MATH SIPP+ model.

Overview of the Simulation Model

The 2012 baseline of the 2009 MATH SIPP+ model, which is the model used in this report, uses FY 2009 values for the income and asset thresholds, maximum benefits and deductions and simulates the federal and state asset and categorical eligibility rules. Because the model is based on 2009 data, the parameter values are adjusted from 2012 dollars to 2009 dollars. Rather than simply applying CalFresh eligibility rules to reported households or families, the model first divides household members into CalFresh units according to CalFresh rules about who must apply for CalFresh together.

Because the SIPP underreports program participation, the MATH SIPP+ model stimulates both TANF and SSI recipients. This is particularly important to CalFresh eligibility determination in California because of the state "cash-out" policy, which makes California SSI recipients categorically ineligible for CalFresh.

The MATH SIPP+ model uses an algorithm to select participants from the pool of households simulated to be eligible. The algorithm incorporates caseload and characteristic targets derived from CalFresh quality control data to ensure that the baseline simulated participant population is similar to the participant population in the administrative data.
