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Defining the Program Access Index (PAI)



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What is the PAI?

The PAI measures CalFresh utilization among individuals who meet select CalFresh eligibility criteria.



Calculating the PAI


- The PAI compares two populations.
- 1) CalFresh participants

-and-

- 2) Individuals
 - With incomes <125% poverty;
 - Who don't participate in FDPIR; and
 - Don't receive SSI



Calculating the PAI



The PAI...

ls	Is Not
 Based on three CalFresh eligibility criteria 	× A measure of participation among fully eligible individuals
 One indicator of how well counties reach low-income individuals 	× A comprehensive tool for evaluating county CalFresh administration
 An estimate associated with a specific period of time 	× Designed to definitively track trends over time

Why Calculate the PAI?

We need measures to assess how well

- -CalFresh reaches eligible individuals
- CalFresh administrative policies and practices serve eligible individuals



Why Calculate the PAI?

USDA does <u>not</u> calculate participation rates by county

- CalFresh administrative policies and practices vary by county
- -Demographics vary by county

San Bernardino	0.928
Solano	0.889


Economic Impacts of CalFresh



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Lost Dollars, Empty Plates

- Estimates federal dollars and economic activity associated with CalFresh utilization
- County-level analysis incorporates the PAI (2011)
- State-level analysis incorporates USDA's state participation rate (2010)



Lost Dollars, Empty Plates

Statewide Snapshot		
Eligible Non-Participants	3.4 million	
Lost Federal Dollars (Benefits)	\$4.7 billion	
Lost Economic Activity	\$8.3 billion	
Lost State Tax Revenue (General Fund)	\$83 million	
Lost County Tax Revenue	\$38 million
