Subject: Support AB 1560 (Fuentes) – Food for Health



Problem

Currently, only one out of every two eligible Californians participates in CalFresh; California has the lowest participation rate in the nation. Many Medi-Cal recipients are eligible for CalFresh, but don't participate. Because of the fundamental connection between health and nutrition, this bill aims to better align CalFresh and Medi-Cal eligibility, ensuring that low-income Californians get the nutrition they need to support health and well-being.

What does AB 1560 do?

AB 1560 streamlines CalFresh eligibility for Medi-Cal recipients and their families. Using a strategy known as categorical eligibility, this bill removes one of two CalFresh income barriers for Medi-Cal recipients and their families. By streamlining CalFresh eligibility for Medi-Cal recipients and their families these two complementary benefits are more closely aligned.

AB 1560 connects children in these households with free school meals. AB 1560 will provide households with a Medi-Cal recipient better access to CalFresh benefits, and because of an existing policy known as direct certification, children in those households will also be automatically certified for free school meals.

AB 1560 further connects health and nutrition. In 2014, an additional 2 million Californians will become newly eligible for Medi-Cal under health care reform. Aligning these programs now can increase CalFresh participation in the future.

Why Support AB 1560?

AB 1560 increases CalFresh participation among current and new Medi-Cal recipients, and their families.

- This bill would increase CalFresh participation by 227,000 Californians.
- AB 1560 will most impact working households with children that rely on Medi-Cal, and still have incomes below 100% of the federal poverty level. Currently, only 36% of eligible, low-income, working households participate in SNAP.

AB 1560 is a fiscally responsible bill that draws down federal nutrition benefits into the state and local economies.

- AB 1560 could bring in up to \$10 million in federal nutrition benefits to the state; USDA has shown that every dollar in SNAP (known as CalFresh in California) expenditures generates \$1.79 in economic activity.
- This bill would bring California up to speed with 27 other states that use categorical eligibility as an effective enrollment strategy.

AB 1560 reduces duplicative applications and calculations.

Caseworkers will no longer need to determine CalFresh gross-income eligibility for Medi-Cal recipients and their families. Parents in these households will no longer need to fill out an application for their children to receive free school meals.

AB 1560 provides low-income households with a package of benefits: food at home and meals at school.

• By connecting Medi-Cal recipients and their families with CalFresh, children in those households will also be able to access free school meals without additional paperwork.

California cannot afford to forego federal funds that would help ensure that Medi-Cal recipients and their families can easily access CalFresh to support their health and well-being.
